Scholarships (Colleges and Universities)

- **University of Montana Presidential Leadership Scholarships**

A number of full tuition scholarships and partial scholarships are available to the University of Montana. Expected norms are a cumulative GPA of at least 3.5 as well as an ACT of 27/SAT of 1800. To apply, students must complete an application to the Davidson Honors College, by the deadline listed below. Students not awarded a Presidential Leadership Scholarship will automatically be considered for the Montana Resident Entering Student Scholarship. See Mr. McKernan or visit <http://admissions.umt.edu/resident.html> for applications and information.

Deadline: Application must be postmarked by December 31
- **University of Montana Resident Entering Freshmen Scholarships**

A number of scholarships of varying amounts are available to Montana Residents planning on attending the University of Montana. To qualify, students should have a cumulative GPA of 3.4, and an ACT of 25/SAT of 1700. Please note: if you have completed an application for the Davidson Honors College/UM Presidential Leadership Scholarship you do not need to complete the Resident Entering Freshmen Award application. Deadline: Application must be postmarked by December 31
- **Montana State University Presidential Scholarships**

Up to twenty full-tuition, renewable Presidential Scholarships are available for students planning on attending MSU next year. A 3.75 cumulative G.P.A. and a 30 on the ACT/2000 on the SAT are the expected norms for candidates. The selection committee looks for such qualities as academic distinction, service and leadership, imagination, and research/creativity activities. Finalists must complete an interview at MSU from March 4-6.

- **Montana State University Resident Freshman Premier Scholarships**

A large number of awards, totaling up to \$10,000 (\$2500/year over 4 years) will be awarded to incoming resident freshmen at Montana State University. To apply, students need to complete an application to Montana State, have the SAT/ACT scores officially sent (directly from the testing agency) and complete the Premier Scholarship Application, available at <http://www.montana.edu/admissions/premierscholarship.pdf>. Deadline: Funds are limited, so apply soon!

- Boston University Trustee Scholarships**
 Each year, Boston University awards several 4-year, renewable scholarships to incoming freshmen. Candidates for these awards are nominated by their high schools, and are typically at the top of their class and are active leaders in their schools and communities. See Mr. McKernan or visit www.bu.edu/admissions/trustee for more information about receiving a nomination for this award.
Deadline: Nominations, essays, and applications must be submitted by December 1
- Davidson College (NC) John Montgomery Belk Scholarship**
 Up to five (5) Belk Scholarships are given away each year to students at Davidson College. These scholarships will cover the entire cost of attending Davidson, in addition to two summer stipends to pursue international study and other opportunities. Each high school may nominate one student for this award. See Mr. McKernan for more information.
Deadline: Nominations must be received by November 15, applications by December 1
- Seattle University Sullivan Leadership Award**
 Nine students will be selected to receive four years full tuition, including room and board. Thirty Six finalists will receive scholarship awards ranging from \$11000-\$18500 per year. Winners will be those who demonstrate leadership, a commitment to social justice, good communication skills, and scholarship (3.5 G.P.A. or above). Candidates will be required to attend the Sullivan Leadership Day competition on Saturday, January 16. Finalists are required to attend the final competition day on Friday, February 26.

- Washington University-St. Louis Danforth Scholars Program**
 Several renewable full and partial scholarships are available for study at Washington University-St. Louis. Outstanding candidates will have exhibited a capacity for service and leadership, as well as academic excellence, and will embrace the challenges of a rigorous academic curriculum. Candidates must be nominated for the award.

- **Emory University Scholars Program**
A variety of awards are given each year, ranging from two-thirds tuition to full-tuition, including room and board. Students are invited to nominate themselves for the award. Outstanding nominees will have excellent records of academic achievement, extraordinary personal qualities, and have made significant contributions to the class, their school, and their community. Separate nominations are also available for the Goizueta Business School Scholarships at Emory.

Scholarships (Independent)

- **Wendy's High School Heisman Award Program**
All senior student-athletes are encouraged to apply for this prestigious award which recognizes excellence in academics, athletics, and student leadership. Students must have a cumulative "B" average or better through their junior year, and have participated in at least one sport. All applications must be certified by a school representative before they are official. The National High School Heisman committee will then select our School Winner (one male and one female) from all official applications, whose application will advance to state and national judging levels, for a chance at \$10,000 and a trip to New York for the Heisman Memorial Trophy Weekend events. - **National Commission for Cooperative Education Scholarship Program**
170 renewable merit scholarships of \$6,000/year (\$24,000 total value) are available for students interested in co-op education at one of 8 participating schools. See Mr. McKernan for information on these scholarships or cooperative education, or visit www.co-op.edu.

- **Prudential Spirit of Community Award**
All students involved in community service should apply. One student will be chosen to represent Loyola on the state and national level for scholarship money. Nominee will be honored with the Presidential Volunteer Service Award if they have completed an appropriate number of service hours. - **Burger King Scholars Program**
 Hundreds of nonrenewable \$1000 awards will be given to graduating seniors by Burger King. Students must have a 2.5 cumulative GPA, and work at least 10 hours a week for 40 weeks per year (employment at Burger King is not required). Candidates should also demonstrate participation in community service and/or co-curricular activities, and demonstrate financial need. - **Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation**
 Each year, Coca-Cola gives away \$3 million in scholarships to 250 students nationwide in \$20,000 and \$10,000 awards. Students who demonstrate leadership, commitment to community, and academic achievement should apply. Visit www.coca-colascholars.org for applications and information.

- **Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarship**
 500 scholarships totaling over \$2.2 million are available at the local, state, and national levels to graduating high school seniors planning on attending college. Competitive candidates will be top students, active in their schools and communities, recognized as leaders by their peers, and in need of financial assistance. - **Elks National Foundation Legacy Awards**
 250 renewable, \$1,000 scholarships (\$4000 total value) are available to graduating seniors who are the children or grandchildren of Elk members. Candidates must also demonstrate the core values of the Elks National Foundation: Knowledge, Charity, Community, and Integrity and have taken an SAT or ACT by December 31.
